Within Biobank Sweden, there are sample service coordinators facilitating collecting and utilising biobank samples for research.



Starting new research studies, identifying previously collected biobank samples and making withdrawals of material collected at several places in Sweden require knowledge within the biobank field.

To facilitate these processes for researchers conducting national studies, there are sample service coordinators across Sweden. They have expertise and a vast network within the biobanking field.

Their task is to be a support for researchers conducting national research studies, i.e., where sample collection is performed at more than one site in the country. In addition, they contribute to increasing the use of previously collected biobank samples from both healthcare and research sample collections.
