L2a1a. Example of wording regarding the transfer of conditions in “L2a1. AGREEMENT about making Human Biological Material available to a Research Principal for an Action” to a Third Party

An agreement “L2a1. AGREEMENT about making Human Biological Material available to a Research Principal for an Action” is established between the Principal of the Biobank and the Research Principal.

The text below is an example and can be used to transfer the conditions in the agreement to a Third Party. The text only relates to the transfer and handling of Material that the Third Party shall receive.

Please note, that universities may have developed more extensive agreements (e.g. including terms for the assignment or collaboration such as ownership and use rights of results, publication, personal data processing, etc.) that are to be established between the university and the legal entity referred to in the L2a1 agreement as a Third Party, and where the transfer of the terms of the L2a1 agreement is to be included. Always check with the university's lawyers before an agreement is signed.

Parties

This Agreement on the transfer of human biological materials (“Agreement”) is signed between
..... (Research Principal), and the recipient of samples
..... (Recipient), each a “Party” and collectively hereafter referred to
as the “Parties”.

The Parties hereby agree as follows:

Governing Agreement and General Conditions

- 1.1. The Parties agree that the conditions in the Material Transfer Agreement, “L2a1. AGREEMENT about making Human Biological Material available to a Research Principal for an Action” (including any appendices), between the Research Principal and the Principal of the Biobank, shall be the governing conditions (“Governing Conditions”) of this Agreement.
- 1.2. The Governing Conditions, and therein specified rights and obligations, shall, with appropriate changes, be in force between the Parties of this Agreement.
- 1.3. The Governing Conditions shall be attached to this Agreement.
